Peter Lenker

Some recent work in ceramics by local resident and ceramist Peter Lenker will be exhibited in an upcoming show at the Redlands Art Association Gallery.

As Featured Artist, Lenker is displaying a collection of small stoneware jars, and some pieces fired by a primitive pit-fire technique.

Lenker received his MFA in ceramic sculpture at UC Santa Barbara (1981). He has been a professional production potter in New Zealand and in Australia.

This recent work reflects on some elements from the past, including examples of classic celadon glazes of ancient Asian origin, and also some glazes reminiscent of ash-fired pots.

Elizabeth Carr

Elizabeth Carr was always very interested in Art. Like most people she was raised to believe that there is no money to be made in that career choice. She went to school & got a Computer Science degree. For over 20 years she spent 40 - 70 hours a week in front of a keyboard.

In 2003 she took her first watercolor class. She studied painting with many great teachers including Sylvia Megerdician, Chris VanWinkle, Tom Fong and Collage artist Gerald Brommer. She works mainly with Mixed media and Collage. She spent years selling her work at art festivals & now has a small gallery called Studio C, 260 W Bonita Ave, Claremont.

Her statement for this show reads:

"Travels - abstracted"

I've been an abstract painter since I picked up a brush. This body of work is all about my fascination with the way people live. When I am in an airplane looking down at the landscape there is an intense curiosity about the places people live. When they live in the middle of the country, on farmland I wonder about how they got there and what they are doing at the moment we fly over. I start with one of these impressions in my head and balance the painting with values. My signature touch is the collage papers I add. I love the patterns and textures they add."

Featured Artist Linda Richards brings her Father's Vintage Photos to Life

Featured artist Linda Richards from Redlands will be showcasing her vintage themed oil paintings in her show, "Scenes from my Father's Past," at the Redlands Art

Association Gallery from May 13th through June 3rd.

After her father died, Richards discovered negatives of black and white photos he took as a young unmarried man in the late 30s and early 40s. Some were from stage shows in Chicago or New York, some from road trips throughout the country.

Recognizing their importance, she contacted a couple museums to see if they were interested, but the subject matter and featured cities covered too wide a range.

Now she's finally found them a home - through her color oil painting renditions.

Richards says it's been a fun journey to map out his travels. In several cases, she's returned to the places he stood to take his photos. "When I was in New York in December, I found the vantage point at Times Square and also one on Wall Street," she says. She has also discovered how he took them, from the back of a taxi or perhaps his Dad's car. One of her paintings from

Time Square shows her grandfather in the crowd. "I love how they tell stories, or how they show quirky vaudeville shows popular at the time, and of course, the street scenes are full of vintage cars and even old Checker cabs," Richards says.

The biggest challenge was also the most fun, choosing what colors to use. Some feature a limited sepia palette, while others like the Time's Square scenes are full of color. She's happy to give them a new voice through her paintings, and to honor her father by exhibiting his original photographs in her show. She also wonders how many people have old vintage photographs in their family that could be put to similar use.

Richards welcomes all to her reception at the Redlands Art Association on Saturday, May 20th from 4 to 6 pm.



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

At the time of writing this film has not yet been theatrically released and has just begun tours of film festivals throughout the USA and internationally. So far, it has received special spotlighting at the 2016 Venice Film Festival, 2016 Toronto Film Festival, 2016 Telluride Film Festival, 2017 Sundance Film Festival and making the Best of Fest List at the 2017 Palm Springs International Film Festival. The story centers on a 20 year old German woman (Paula Beer) who lost her fiancé in France during World War I, live with his parents in a small town in Germany, and has no expectation of future happiness. One day she meets a young man (Pierre Niney), a stranger from France, visiting her fiancé's grave. He is not welcomed in this German town as there is a lot of hostility towards the French since they were adversaries during the war and though the war is over the hatred transcends. As the story unfolds, the viewer is kept transfixed as the mystery of the stranger deepens when he suddenly disappears just as she and her fiance's parents begin to trust him. The film is analogous to that of a good book which plot unravels slowly so that you can't put it down until you get to the end. Director Ozon has woven a beautiful tale of loss and redemption. The beauty is enhanced since Ozon filmed it mostly in black and white using its richness to emphasize the period and genre very reminiscent of some of the great classic movies of yesteryear.

Learn the Uncommon Method of Obvara Firing: A Workshop for Potters & Ceramic Artists

Obvara is an unusual method of marking and sealing ceramic pots using a fermented brew thought to have evolved in Eastern Europe throughout the 12th and 19th centuries.

The Obvara method leaves striking monochromatic marks on the scalded surface of each piece, resulting in uniquely patterned designs that often resembles stars streaking through the galaxy. Entirely non-toxic, different brews create different results.

You'll learn how different dipping techniques can result in different patterns, how to make fermented mashes, and the technical requirements for the entire obvara process. It's similar to Raku in that you will work with pots hot from the kiln.

Bring 4-6 pieces of bisque-fired, thermal-shock resistant white stoneware. Pieces should be 4-8 inches in diameter. You may bring pots with surfaces cracked with sodium silicate or treated with Terra sigillata as long as they are thermal-shock resistant. Fermented brews will be provided.

Instructor: Kim Munkres, of Earth Interrupted Pottery, explores old ceramic practices such as Obvara (leaven) and pit firing, as well as digging, processing, and firing local clays in addition to high fire ceramics.
