♦ YOUR OUTGOING PRESIDENT: LIZ COVIELLO

he last two years have been an incredible journey for me. From becoming President of the Operating Committee to President of the Board of Directors, time has flown by. The RAA weathered the recession, but we came out carrying an unsustainable large deficit.

So we made cut backs—not always popular—to coordinator hours, raised our take-in fees, cut the printed newsletter and were frugal with what we spent. We experimented with opening on Market Nights and a later closing time for the run-up to Christmas. We changed membership from calendarto year-round and as a result more and more people are joining RAA either as members showing their art or taking art classes with the membership discount. Adult Education under Joyce Hatzidakis, and then Linda Willason, expanded and we now offer a broad selection of new classes to the community. Suzanne Burke as Youth Education Coordinator has been a powerhouse: the Home School Program expanded to 2 mornings a week and we currently offer 5 children's after school classes during the school year. We introduced Opening Receptions for new gallery shows and we've invited all our artists to come and sell some of their work or demonstrate their art on the patio on Market Night. We have a new Marketing team who are pushing ahead and trying to make us more visible in the community have you seen our postcard mailings? MCAEEF continues working diligently with local schools creating the opportunity for art teachers to go into schools, all funded by the Redlands Cinema Classics at the Krikorian Theatre.

Best of all, art sales in the gallery are on a record-breaking rise. Our cut backs and everyone's hard work has paid off. At the end of this financial year we finish in the black. But we can't stop there, under Maggie we will continue to expand our sales and presence in the community and hopefully our sales will continue to rise through the next financial year.

I know I've missed lots: I would like to thank Candy Glendening and Grace Fermier for their hard work each month ensuring there is an on-line newsletter for all of us to read, my fellow board members for their patience with my long agendas and hard work! We have already said goodbye to Diane McLaughlin, Karen Coates and Tony Radcliffe from the board this year and we are now saying goodbye to Jan Harvey and Christine White—thank you all for your hard work. It's been fun and an incredible opportunity over the last two years to meet and work alongside an amazing talented group of local artists.

Patty and Hayden and Evelyn Ifft are retiring as Featured Artist Coordinators. They do such great work behind the scenes and we thank you both for all your hard work.

My expiration date might be up but I'm not disappearing, I'll still be working in the gallery. I'm thrilled to be passing the reins to Maggie Macro for the next year. I know it's going to be an incredible journey for her and I hope she enjoys it as much as I have done.

Remember, Henri Matisse said, "Creativity takes courage"—wishing everyone success in their personal artistic endeavors.

Gallery Agreements

Two reminders.... When was the last time you read through your gallery agreement? Did you see the small print where it says anything left in the gallery after 28 days is deemed abandoned and becomes the property of RAA for us to dispose of as we see fit? Please collect your art in a timely fashion or make arrangements for it to be collected—we still have one piece of MMMS art in the gallery!

Why is it important? We have no storage space for artwork. And we don't want to accidently damage work. Our new cupboards hold supplies for 7 children's art classes a week, 4 adult classes plus workshops and meetings all in the East Gallery. Teachers need the big table to prepare their work for classes, or to temporarily put finished art on it to dry, etc. before the end of class. So please promptly pick up your work or you will lose it.

Take-In

Have you noticed we are trying to improve the flow of traffic in the gallery at Take-In? We are opening the patio gates and doors for easier access for artists carrying bags of paintings and boxes of ceramics. Please try and remember to sign out your work from the last show and sign up for a sitting date before sitting down to pay. Its speeds it up for everyone trying to pay.

REMEMBER THERE WILL BE NO JULY NEWSLETTER.

The next due date for newsletter submission is Thursday, August 3rd.

Refreshing the Gallery: Gallery closing Saturday, August 5th until Friday, August 11th.

August 4th Take-Down only! The gallery is closed from 5-10th August, inclusive.

What does refreshing entail? Replacing the carpet on the walls, painting, moving and rearranging furniture and more. Francis Wiley, Stephanie Heaston and an entire team of people are taking on this long overdue job.

The new show "Celebrate" has been postponed for one week to the 11th of August. Please, please, please, either collect your art on Friday, August 4th between 9am and 7pm or make arrangements to collect it in the week prior to Take-Down.

We don't want to put art in the shed but if it's left behind that's where it will go—jewelry into plastic bags, table items wrapped as best as possible in newspaper and paintings between cardboard. I know some artists were upset for the MMMS because we were ringing them to collect their art and it wasn't convenient... but what if that picture or table art had been damaged? Nobody wants that to happen.

If you would like to help in some way with Refreshing the Gallery, there is a sign-up sheet on the desk.

Take-In for the "Celebrate" theme show moved to August 11th.

August 11th is Take-In for "Celebrate" between 9am and 7pm. The Opening Reception will be a joint reception with our Guest Artists. Lex Torres is from Rancho Cucamonga and Jen Handi from Riverside on Sunday 13th August at 2pm. Come and see our refurbished gallery, meet the guest artists and see you own work on display.

Tips for shows...

Oops, there was a bit of a mishap for one of our artists at Art in the Park over a cash sale. She gave the wrong pieces of purchased art to one of her customers who didn't return it! She had to apologize and sort out something for the customer who didn't get the art they purchased. Sadly, the person who was given the wrong art didn't return it and hasn't contacted the gallery about it either.

So, will it ever happen to one of us? Yes, I did exactly the same thing!

The only remedy I can suggest is write the customer's name on the sales ticket, BUT also get a phone number! I've learnt to staple a business card with the customer's name onto the bag and hopefully it will never happen again, but if it does, you can at least contact the customer by telephone and try to sort it out without losing a sale and money.

One other show tip... clearly write out the price. If, for example, it is \$150.00 make sure the person at the pay station can understand its \$150 and not read it wrongly as \$1.50! That nearly happened to me as well! I know we are all in a hurry but those few extra seconds taking care of our sales receipts will, hopefully, create a better sales experience for ourselves and our customers.


BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND! ARTIST'S WAY CLASS

Featured Artist: Lori Worby-Krebs

Lori Worby-Krebs is the featured artist at Redlands Art Association June 24-July 18, 2017. She is a local artist who has lived most of her life in Southern California and worked as a high school



counselor and teacher for 22 years in Redlands before she decided to follow her creative heart and paint. In 2011, she moved to a quiet lake town in Alabama with her retired husband and aging mother where she nurtured her creative side with a set of acrylic paints she had in waiting. She knew then what had been missing in her life and she has been working on her creative talents ever since. Art and being creative were always important to her and she really wanted a fine arts degree but instead relied on her college art classes and now takes workshops with artists she admires. Lori considers herself an emerging, self-driven, self directed artist and works daily in her studios in Alabama and California where she allows her heart, intuition and observations in life guide her.



"Dance of Life" is the theme of her show and is her metaphor for understanding what is really important in daily living. For this show she wanted to portray people who are having a good time, embracing each other

and living life undivided despite the differences people share. "The idea that we can choose how to dance our way through life and face our challenges with hopeful outcomes" was her inspiration for this show. She calls her art "IF" art because she starts with an "Idea" and then sees her idea come to "Fruition" on the canvas. She gets her ideas from observing life's many circumstances and says painting ideas lets her

truths and lessons in life. Her acrylic palette is colorful and her abstract figures show movement and rhythm

with bold shapes and contrasting values. Her first paintings in this series were simply dancing figures that are depicted in party like shapes having fun. Subsequent works display other aspects of living and evolved into her "Spiritual"

TTeri's watermedia paintings are abstract, and not so abstract. Her current works grow from landscape and architectural themes, reacting to what she sees and translating it into



form, color, texture and shape. Those reactions have changed in style during her explorations, but with a few constants: color and light permeate her paintings.



Sometimes the work is more about light, sometimes more about color. More often than not, her paintings are a

result of reactions to whatever is happening on the painted surface. She goes beyond reporting what's been observed. Blurred lines between objective and subjective imagery coexist within her work, with shapes that suggest, rather than dictate. Continually adjusting color, form, shape and texture during the painting process keeps her looking forward to each new

exploration.

viewer and elicit their own reactions.

traditional photography,




and is both beautiful and thought-provoking. This show will include examples of her photographic art, going well beyond the usual—don't miss it!

"I believe that everything is connected—the earth, the sea, all life forms and the universe. My way of showing this philosophy is in my technique of "see-through" arcs and lack of perspective.



Unlike usual perspective which places objects in




the foreground as larger, in my paintings size does not matter. As in sumi scrolls, the higher in the painting, the farther is the object. In my paintings, an object can be the same size, whether in foreground or background.

My intention is for the viewer to be engrossed visually in the painting, with the eye continuing to follow new paths in lines, planes and values. The painting is successful

if the viewer sees traditional objects which morph into semi-abstract design.

then back into representation, a circular path.

Currently my paintings are vertical half sheets, with an underpainting of watercolor and vertical or horizontal dashes in gouache on top. The effect is one of a tapestry when viewed up close. When viewed farther away, the painting becomes one of a usual watercolor."

Above the Stem Floral Studio created an arrangement of succulents to compliment Michael Cumo's bird paintings.


