Artist Bio:

As a landscape painter, I love

the great outdoors, particularly the scenes of the southwestern deserts and coastlines. Mostly I paint, with pastels in air, as I enjoy being in nature, looking at a beautiful scene, and translating the emotions of what I see onto the paper. My hope is that I am able to convey in my art the feelings of joy and tranquility that I experience when painting.

Since childhood, drawing, coloring and painting have always been my passion. While Social Work was my major in college, painting continued to be my first love and I completed a minor in Fine Art. Although my career as a social worker was fulfilling, I always wanted to have more time to paint. In 2003, I retired from social work and began to apply my love for art, now as a fulltime artist.

FEBRUARY PROGRAM

Color in Painting: History, Classification Systems, Symbolism, and Artists' Thoughts By Prof. Linda Kay Zoeckler, M.A., M.L.S.

Tuesday, February 22 at 7pm

What is the most exciting, creative, and fun element of painting? Many artists would answer color, though others would reply line, subject matter, etc. Please join us Tuesday, Feb 22 at 7pm at the Gallery 215 E. State St, downtown, Redlands to learn the answers to Zoeckler's questions...

What are the definitions of terms used in discussing color? What is hue as opposed to value, intensity, tone, tint, and saturation? How is a color defined and just how many colors exist? What are colors made of, and are today's colors different from earlier colors? When did synthetic pigments appear? What are fugitive colors? When were cakes of color devised? When were tubes of color devised? What is a binder and are there numerous types of binders? What is the difference between tempera and oil? When and where did oil painting arise and what were its new capabilities?

How old is the history of color? Why did the Greeks have no names for blue or green? Why do rainbows not look the same in paintings from different centuries? Why do earlier versions of the Bible mention or describe fewer colors and less often than later versions of the Bible? Why did some cultures forbid the use of certain colors? What have various colors symbolized throughout history? Culturally color has been defined differently and its symbols change from one culture to another. How does color relate to music, sound, or alchemy?

How does one study color? Scientists, painters, and poets, have all studied color and — using different methods — arrived at different answers. What major color classification systems have been devised and

when did they appear? When and why did the color wheel appear and what is it based upon? Just how many color wheels are there and are they the only way of



representing color classification systems?

What pigments did certain artists use and how did they arrange them on their palettes? How did they carry them? What do artists paint boxes and portable easels look like? How do some artists select color combinations in a painting? What are the rules of using color and should there be any rules?

What do some well-known artists say about color? Eugene Delacroix famously asserted "Give me mud and I will make the skin of Venus out of it, if you allow me to surround it as I please." Art is transformation — in the hands of talent it is mud to miracle.

Mini Art Makes a Major Show: REDLANDS ART ASSOCIATION'S 49th Annual MULTI MEDIA MINI SHOW 2018

Mini Art Treasures!

The 4th Annual Multi-Media Mini Show, sponsored by the Redlands Art Association, will be on exhibit February 22 through March 15 at the Gallery and Art Center, 215 E. State Street, downtown, Redlands. The Grand Opening will be Friday, Feb. 23 from 5 to 7pm.

ORIGINALITY, QUALITY, VARIETY

The Mini Show has been unique to the Redlands Art Association. What makes it different is the limitation of the art piece to 14.5" including base or frame and that all media is accepted. For example, artists can submit photography, digital (computer) work, fiber art, drawings, glass, sculptures in wood – stone – and metal, as well as the traditional fine arts. Naturally, its success has spawned similar shows, however, the MMM Show is still the only one of this scale in Southern California.

The MMM Show is open to all California artists and/ or RAA members. This juror for the show is noted photographer, Sant Khalsa. Ms. Khalsa will choose the winners of the competition and award over \$2000 in cash and product awards.

Any artist residing in California or a member of the Redlands Art Association may submit up to three recent pieces of work, of their original design. Entry is in person, Sunday, Feb. 18, 10am–4pm, at the RAA Sales Gallery & Art Center, 215 E. State St., downtown, Redlands. State St., Redlands or call, 909-792-8435. **The Juror** – Sant Khalsa is an artist, educator and curator whose projects develop from her inquiry into the nature of place, and complex environmental and societal issues. Her photographs, mixed media sculptures and installation



works have been shown internationally in more than 175 exhibitions and are acquired by museum collections including the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, Center for Creative Photography in Tucson, Nevada Museum of Art in Reno and UCR/California Museum of Photography. Khalsa is a recipient of fellowships, awards and grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, California Arts Council, California Council for the Humanities, Center for Photographic Art in Carmel, and others. In March 2012, she was honored as the first recipient of the Society for Photographic Education's Insight Award for her significant contributions to the field of photography.

Her artworks are published in many books and exhibition catalogues including Altered Landscape: Photographs of a Changing Environment (Skira/ Rizzoli, 2011), Seismic Shift (The Getty and University of California Riverside/California Museum of Photography, 2011), Backyard Oasis (The Getty, Palm Springs Art Museum and DelMonico Books, 2012), and Art in Action: Nature, Creativity and Our Collective Future (Natural World Museum and Earth Aware Editions, 2007). She is a Professor of Art. Emerita at California State University. San Bernardino, where she has been on the faculty since 1988 and served as the Chair of the Department of Art (2003-2012). She resides in Joshua Tree and is represented by Kopeikin Gallery in Los Angeles.

I began my journey as an artist when I was in high school art class for four years. I began taking oil painting classes in my twenties when I was living in Riverside. I enjoyed painting as a hobby until I started working full time for the County of Riverside. I took a hiatus on art for most of that time period. Then I accepted an early retirement



offer from the County in 2010. Since then I have taken many art classes through Redlands Art Assoc. such as Oil Painting with Chick Curtis; Still Life Painting with Martha Cowan; Assemblage/Altered Art with Richard Freund; Copper Jewelry with Tia Shira; Pastels with Patricia Ford; Mosaics with Ada Jarvis, and probably a few others I've left out.

I've enjoyed all of the various classes I've participated in but the medium or type of artwork I am passionate about is Assemblage/Altered Art. I can truly express my creativity through this art form. The artwork I create is done in a three-part process: assembling the creation, prepping the piece for painting, and finally the painting process using fluid acrylic paints. I have entered my assemblage art in many Multi Media Mini Shows since then and a number of my pieces have been accepted. I have participated in Art on State Street & continue to sell my pieces through the Redlands Art Association. I hope to continue my journey through the world of art as long as I enjoy doing it and others enjoy seeing it.

Ada began formal instruction in painting and scientific illustration after high school. She paints with acrylics and oils. Her specialties are historic or personal buildings, scenes and Harleys painted on decorative glass balls and mini canvases which are



sold in Redlands, Mission Inn and on commission. Her art has been shown and/or sold in Oregon, Ohio, B.C., Maryland, Tennessee and California. Meet Suzanne Burke, RAA Board Member



Suzanne Burke has enjoyed working with the Redlands Art Association for 6 years. She is the Youth Education Coordinator and currently teaches one of the two Homeschool classes offered at RAA. She also serves on the MCAEEF committee.

Growing up in a Navy family, Suzanne moved around as a youngster. She calls Coronado, CA. her hometown and visits there often. Suzanne always had a sketchpad in her hands growing up. She drew everything. Animals, landscapes and famous buildings (old churches and the Hotel Del Coronado) were her favorites. She loved building sets for her High School theater productions. Also, she entered a few drawings into school and community art shows as a teenager.

While studying Art at San Diego State University, Suzanne worked at a Heraldry Shop in the Hotel Del Coronado where she got to draw Coats of Arms for customers who wanted these family symbols reproduced into paintings and embroideries. Suzanne received her Bachelor's Degree in Liberal Studies and an Elementary Education Teaching Credential in 1988. She taught 3rd grade for many years. In 1997, Suzanne moved to Redlands, married her husband Rob in 1999, and continued teaching elementary school until her first child was born in 2000.

Suzanne believes her greatest accomplishment is raising her 2 boys, now 17 and 14. When her oldest son started school, Suzanne got involved with PTA and helped with the art program at Smiley Elementary School. The art program used at Smiley needed parent volunteers to help prep and teach the art lessons. This was the perfect opportunity for Suzanne to be involved in something she loved.

In 2012, Suzanne started teaching Children's Academy classes at RAA. And in 2014, she accepted the position of Coordinator of Youth Education. She also chairs the Education Committee. The RAA Youth Education Program was redesigned two years before Suzanne came to RAA. The program incorporates Academy Classes and Creative Journey classes. Academy Classes are classes based on the Elements of Art. Creative Journey Classes are the teacher's choice of art media or expertise. Suzanne implements and experiments with new classes giving the children of Redlands some great art opportunities.

Suzanne's personal favorite medium is watercolor. Her portfolio is growing and she hopes one day soon to display some of her own work in the RAA gallery.

Mersereau Memories



"I believe that everything is connected: the earth, the sea, all life forms and the universe. My way of showing this philasophy is my technique of "see-through" arcs and lack of perspective. I use brilliant, colorful watercolors in which shapes overlap and reveal underlying designs. Symbols are used for familiar objects, and representation is carried almost to semi-abstraction.

My intention is for the viewer to be engrossed visually in the painting, with the eye continuing to follow new paths in lines, planes and values. The painting is successful if the viewer sees traditional objects which morph into semiabstract design, then back into representation; a circular path.

Painting is a way of playing mental "hide and seek." I paint solids transparent to show interconnection. All is fun, all is play.

It's exciting to try new color combinations, changing an ordinary horizontal land or seascape into a vertical...or going wild with complements, such as red for trees and orange for skies. I try to push my next painting to levels above what I have just completed. If I am successful, someone will be connected emotionally. As it is, when I'm painting, I truly touch the depths of who I am."

oanna Mersereau was an active member of Redlands Art Association for many years. I first met her ten years ago working at the desk for Take-In with her friend Harriet Singer. Joanna was a long term resident of Riverside but as her health declined she moved to Redlands and retired from her volunteer work at Take-In. Many of you know her distinctive style of painting from her watercolors, tiles and cards for sale in RAA and from several locations in Riverside and at Art For Heaven's Sake.

Sadly, Joanna passed away in mid-December, still with ideas for new paintings and projects. On Saturday 6th January there was a Celebration of her Life at Redlands United Church of Christ with family and friends. Here is the front and the back of the program with some



pictures of her work and a piece she wrote about her inspiration for her art.

To conclude the service her great grandson stood up and read some advice Joanna had written for customers when purchasing art and her reply!

12 Things NOT to say to an artist.

- 1. My son could do that! So where is this genius? Is he cutting a deal with Christies?
- I have an aunt who is an artist! Let me guess, just like that great artist on TV, who can make a masterpiece with happy trees in one show?
- 3. How long did it take you to do that? Since birth.
- That must be really fun to do! Oh yes ... if you enjoy poverty, rejection and working with hazardous materials.
- I am an artist too and I'd like to selling my work. Where do you find galleries? What is a portfolio? Where do you get slides? And what do I put on a resume?

No response necessary.

6. I may not know much about art but, I know what I like.

Again, no response necessary ... you are dealing with a real mental heavyweight.

- 7. I wish I had time to do stuff like that! After rearranging your sock drawer and flossing, you couldn't POSSIBLY fit it in.
- 8. Did someone make that? No, it grew there.
- I would like something for over my sofa, could you do this mauve, puce and teal?
 Why don't you buy a new sofa or have an extra cushion made and glue it up there?
- 10. The only real art is in New York! *Move to New York.*
- 11. Anybody can do that! You are so right...Any six-year-old ... with twenty years of experience.
- 12. What IS it? Just whisper something obscene.

I am sure most artists will recognize these or similar remarks and her thoughts!

We will still continue to sell Joanna's art in the gallery for the foreseeable future.
