Color in Painting: History, Classification Systems, Symbolism, and Artists' Thoughts By Prof. Linda Kay Zoeckler, M.A., M.L.S.

Tuesday, February 27 at 7pm

What is the most exciting, creative, and fun element of painting? Many artists would answer color, though others would reply line, subject matter, etc. Please join us Tuesday, Feb 22 at 7pm at the Gallery 215 E. State St, downtown, Redlands to learn the answers to Zoeckler's questions...

What are the definitions of terms used in discussing color? What is hue as opposed to value, intensity, tone, tint, and saturation? How is a color defined and just how many colors exist? What are colors made of, and are today's colors different from earlier colors? When did synthetic pigments appear? What are fugitive colors? When were cakes of color devised? When were tubes of color devised? What is a binder and are there numerous types of binders? What is the difference between tempera and oil? When and where did oil painting arise and what were its new capabilities?

How old is the history of color? Why did the Greeks have no names for blue or green? Why do rainbows not look the same in paintings from different centuries? Why do earlier versions of the Bible mention or describe fewer colors and less often than later versions of the Bible? Why did some cultures forbid the use of certain colors? What have various colors symbolized throughout history? Culturally color has been defined differently and its symbols change from one culture to another.



How does color relate to music, sound, or alchemy?

How does one study color? Scientists, painters, and poets, have all studied color and — using different methods — arrived at different answers. What major color classification systems have been devised and when did they appear? When and why did the color wheel appear and what is it based upon? Just how many color wheels are there and are they the only way of representing color classification systems?

What pigments did certain artists use and how did they arrange them on their palettes? How did they carry them? What do artists paint boxes and portable easels look like? How do some artists select color combinations in a painting? What are the rules of using color and should there be any rules?

What do some well-known artists say about color? Eugene Delacroix famously asserted "Give me mud and I will make the skin of Venus out of it, if you allow me to surround it as I please." Art is transformation — in the hands of talent it is mud to miracle.

Now retired, Zoekler taught Art History at Golden West College in Huntington Beach, CA.

The 49th Annual Multi-Media Mini Show, sponsored by the Redlands Art Association, will be on exhibit Feb. 22 through March 15 at the Gallery and Art Center, 215 E. State Street, downtown, Redlands. The Grand Opening will be Friday, Feb. 23 from 5 to 7pm.

ORIGINALITY, QUALITY, VARIETY

The Mini Show has been unique to the Redlands Art Association. What makes it different is the limitation of the art piece to 14.5" including base or frame and that all media is accepted. For example, artists can submit photography, digital (computer) work, fiber art, drawings, glass, sculptures in wood – stone – and metal, as well as the traditional fine arts. Naturally, its success has spawned similar shows, however, the MMM Show is still the only one of this scale in Southern California.

The MMM Show is open to all California artists and/ or RAA members. This juror for the show is noted photographer, Sant Khalsa. Ms. Khalsa will choose the winners of the competition and award over \$2000 in cash and product awards.

Any artist residing in California or a member of the Redlands Art Association may submit up to three recent pieces of work, of their original design. Entry is in person, Sunday, Feb. 18, 10am–4pm, at the RAA Sales Gallery & Art Center, 215 E. State St., downtown, Redlands. The Juror – Sant Khalsa is an artist, educator and curator whose projects develop from her inquiry into the nature of place, and complex environmental and societal issues. Her photographs, mixed media sculptures and installation



works have been shown internationally in more than 175 exhibitions and are acquired by museum collections including the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, Center for Creative Photography in Tucson, Nevada Museum of Art in Reno and UCR/California Museum of Photography. Khalsa is a recipient of fellowships, awards and grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, California Arts Council, California Council for the Humanities, Center for Photographic Art in Carmel, and others. In March 2012, she was honored as the first recipient of the Society for Photographic Education's Insight Award for her significant contributions to the field of photography.

Her artworks are published in many books and exhibition catalogues including Altered Landscape: Photographs of a Changing Environment (Skira/ Rizzoli, 2011), Seismic Shift (The Getty and University of California Riverside/California Museum of Photography, 2011), Backyard Oasis (The Getty, Palm Springs Art Museum and DelMonico Books, 2012), and Art in Action: Nature, Creativity and Our Collective Future (Natural World Museum and Earth Aware Editions, 2007). She is a Professor of Art. Emerita at California State University. San Bernardino, where she has been on the faculty since 1988 and served as the Chair of the Department of Art (2003-2012). She resides in Joshua Tree and is represented by Kopeikin Gallery in Los Angeles.



RAA and Friends of Caroline Park to Feature Plein Air Art Contest

The Redlands Art Association and The Friends of Caroline Park have teamed up to host a plein air art competition, "Celebrate Caroline Park", on Saturday, April 7th. Beginning at 8 am, up to 25 artists will set up at Caroline Park to create spontaneous works inspired by the beauty of Redlands' only native plant park.

A public reception from 5-7 pm at the Redlands Art Association the same day will feature a painting from each participant as the Featured Artists Show, which will run through April 20. Prizes will be awarded by juror Elin Thomas.

RAA member Linda Richards, also a board member with Caroline Park, said the board wanted to introduce more people to the park located along the city's scenic Sunset Drive. "Since many talented artists live the area, a plein air contest during the spring flowering season would showcase both the park and its local artists," says Richards, adding that RAA's co-sponsorship and display of the art makes a very special event.

Anyone is welcome to participate — entry forms are available at RAA, with registration capped at 25 artists. For more information, please contact Linda at gillettrichards@gmail.com or 909-793-1990. Caroline Park was dedicated in 1988 and was built by a group of volunteers and donors led by the late Dr. Harold Hill, a lifelong resident and amateur naturalist who was the Parks Commission Chairman at the time, and a Rotarian. The 14 acres of land was bestowed to the city in 1920 with the stipulation that it be left in its natural state. Today, the park is a beautiful example of land conservation and a demonstration of the natural grace and charm of native plants.

A guided walking tour will take place on 2pm to the public to introduce the park and discuss the benefits of native plants and natural habitat. Abby Harned, Caroline Park board member, says the park is a haven for all types of life from raptors to deer and bobcats, as well as important beneficial insects including pollinators. "Wildlife relies on open space like Caroline Park, and humans need somewhere to connect with nature, a rarity in today's landscaped spaces."

It will be great to capture that beauty in fresh artwork.

At the time of this publication THE INSULT is nominated for an Oscar for BEST FOREIGN LANGUAGE FILM at the 2018 Academy Awards ceremony. There is no surprise that the film has garnered this honour since the storyline, the acting, the dynamic directing and brilliant screenwriting gives the viewer an opportunity to weave through the multi layers of a seemingly ordinary argument between a construction worker for the city and an apartment dweller only to discover that there is so much more than what appears so no the surface. The two protagonists, Tony (Adel Karam) a Lebanese Christian who runs a garage is the apartment dweller and Yasser (Kamel El Basha) a Palestinian refugee is the city worker. They end up in court and the simple civil case escalates into an incredible courtroom drama as the case is moved to the high court where the legal finesse of a high powered prosecutor Wajdi Wethe (Camille Salame) is challenged by a young defense lawyer Nadine (Diamond Abou Abboud) with twists and turns that is reminiscent of the courtroom drama in the1982 Sidney Lumet film THE VERDICT starring Paul Newman. The storyline also brings to the fore the tension that unstit sets between the Christian and Muslim groups in that region. Nora (Marie Leuenberger) is a quiet housewife and mother of two, who lives in a small tranquil Swiss village. She does all the household chores and takes care of her acerbic father-in-law who lives with them. Nora is tired of the tedium of housework and would like to apply for a job outside the home but her husband refuses she cannot disobey him because it's the law. She becomes avid as she listens to Vroni an older widow and former restaurant owner who is publicly campaigning for the women's right to vote. The ancient law in Switzerland forbids women to vote even though it is the 1970's. Vroni organizes a town forum and Nora voices her approval but has a run-in with her husband's boss, a woman who has control of the town's industry and head of the Anti-Politicization of Women Action Committee. Nora learns that all of the men are opposed to it and they will vote on it on February 7, 1971. Nora becomes actively involved with Vroni to campaign for the women's rights to apply for a obsolut the political rights that they are being denied but some insight into their mind and bodies. Jean (Pio Marmai) is the prodigal son returning home to Burgundy, France to the family's vineyard and his ailing father. He has been absent for ten years. As he walks on the country road that leads to the vineyard the viewer is introduced to the beauty of the rolling hills of Burgundy. We meet Jean's two siblings Juliette (Ana Giradot) who has been running the operation of the vineyard during their father's illness and Jeremie (Francois Civil) who lives at an adjacent vineyard run by his father-in-law a prominent winemaker. As the story develops we learn why Jean left and of his life in Australia: of the tight bond and love that exists among the three siblings despite the ten year rift, of their struggle to preserve the family vineyard as they discover the complexities and hardships of inheritance tax. If you enjoy good wine, would like to know about the day to day rigours of an active vineyard , witness the angst of the grower at harvest time, how wine is made, the tastings, the preparation of the soil, the effect of the climate, the glorious celebration at the end of harvest party then you DON'T WANT TO MISS THIS FILM. In this her first feature film writer-director Hamoud brings to the screen an opportunity to demystify any preconceived notion of the life of young Palestinians living, working, studying in Israel. The story centers on three women sharing an apartment in Tel Aviv - Lalia (Mouna Hawa) a criminal lawyer, Salma (Sana Jammelieh) a cook/bartender /DJ and Nur (Shaden Kanboura) religious Muslim University student. Lalia & Salma are modern women who enjoy smoking cigarettes and joints, drinking at clubs and entertaining. Nur does not, but needs a place to stay that's close to school. Lalia's & Salma's party life appear frenetic at times to the sedate Nur who tries to adapt to her newfound exposure to modernity despite disapproval from her religious fiancé and his urgings to leave Tel Aviv and hasten their marriage. We get an insight into the traditional mores that influence their desire to be progressive and modern when Laila falls in love with a modern Muslim man but is he? Salma is subjected to matchmaking demands by her traditional Christian parents and Nur wants a career first not marriage. When something catastrophic occurs to one of them they unify in supportive ways that illustrates some of the circumstances that exist in the Arab-Israeli political world that handicaps the younger generation of both societies from moving forward into the 21st century. The chemistry between these three female leads is delightful with a script and direction that flows beautifully into a refreshingly enjoyable film. ANOTHER NOT FOR WOMEN ONLY FILM.

I began my journey as an artist when I was in high school art class for four years. I began taking oil painting classes in my twenties when I was living in Riverside. I enjoyed painting as a hobby until I started working full time for the County of Riverside. I took a hiatus on art for most of that time period. Then I accepted an early retirement



offer from the County in 2010. Since then I have taken many art classes through Redlands Art Assoc. such as Oil Painting with Chick Curtis; Still Life Painting with Martha Cowan; Assemblage/Altered Art with Richard Freund; Copper Jewelry with Tia Shira; Pastels with Patricia Ford; Mosaics with Ada Jarvis, and probably a few others I've left out.

I've enjoyed all of the various classes I've participated in but the medium or type of artwork I am passionate about is Assemblage/Altered Art. I can truly express my creativity through this art form. The artwork I create is done in a three-part process: assembling the creation, prepping the piece for painting, and finally the painting process using fluid acrylic paints. One of my pieces, entitled "Lucky in Love" was submitted and accepted in the 45th Annual Multi Media Mini Show at the Redlands Art Assoc. Gallery. I won a \$50 Juror's Choice Award for this piece. I have entered my assemblage art in many Multi Media Mini Shows since then and a number of my pieces have been accepted. I have participated in Art on State Street & continue to sell my pieces through the Redlands Art Association. I hope to

continue my journey through the world of art as long as I enjoy doing it and others enjoy seeing it.

For her, clay roots her sense of the divine as a shaper of matter, the feminine as a sacred vessel. In December 2017, her Obvara work was featured in a museum pop-up exhibition at the San Bernardino County Museum. Her work can often be found at the RAA Gallery and at The Blue Door at the Riverside Art Museum.
