"So you want to enter the Big Shows? - Juried shows from A to Z"

Presented by Elin Thomas Tuesday, April 24th, 2018, 7 pm

Elin Thomas (formerly Pendleton) has been active in the art world since 1982, building her career through continuous painting, workshops and self challenges. She was one of the original "Painting A



Day" movement artists, being featured in the *New York Times* along with Duane Keiser for their daily painting challenges. As an emeritus member of Women Artists of the West, she has curated and been receiver for five major shows from professional artists submitting over 150 works to each. She's repacked those shows and has learned a great deal about issues of shipping and receiving.

Her own show career has topped out at the Salmagundi Club in New York City and the Miniature Art Society of Florida, with many shows in all types of venues across the United States. She has done booth shows (La Quinta) and solo gallery shows. Her membership in the American Academy of Equine Art introduced her to artist-in-residence programs and allowed for teaching workshops in distant venues. She is now painting for pleasure and selling those works through social media and her web sites. She only travels via motorcycle, continuing to plein air paint whilst on the road with her beloved pup Sparky.

This presentation will focus on all the accumulative knowledge Elin has of shipping, jurying and a general overview of how to choose which shows to enter and why. Anyone interested in the greater world of art exposure will enjoy this PowerPoint presentation.











May Presentation: 'The Painted Window' A History of Stained Glass

Presented by Jeffery Hitch of Vitraux Studios Tuesday May 22, 7 pm

In this presentation Jeffrey will take you through the thousand-year history of stained glass. We will briefly review how this art emerged and evolved through the ages. We will start in ancient Egypt, travel through the Romanesque period and look at the Gothic period where



great advancements were made. We will move onto the Renaissance, Victorian, Craftsman and Art Deco periods, enjoying slide examples of inspirational work done by Master Artists. He will comment on famous artists such as William Morris, Alphons Mucha, Tiffany, and LaFarge. He will explain and provide slide examples of how



architecture was influenced by stained glass. We will look at the history and evolution of tools and materials, construction and fabrication. We will finish up with a look at what's happening today

in stained glass and where the industry is going. New technologies blended with old world craftmanship have brought stained glass to a whole new level. Examples of my work will be available to provide up close painted

stained glass pieces for the community of Redlands Art Association. There will also be a time for questions and answers at the end of the presentation.




Having graduated from Cal State University Fullerton as a Graphic Design and

Illustration major Jeff spent over half of his career in the advertising industry doing all types of collateral material for companies. Upon leaving the advertising business he taught Drawing, Graphic Design, Photoshop and 2D Design at Concordia University for 3 years. Gradually he became involved with stained glass and finally came back to what he loves most, drawing and painting on glass. He works for stained glass studios across the country on new and old windows

and has been teaching workshops at Beveldine LLC for the past 6 years. He was in a very successful 2 person gallery show at Humphries Gallery in Flintridge 2016, exhibiting a nautical series of glass paintings.

Jeff has a passion for a very unique type of artistic expression. It's a dynamic artistic medium that was in existence before the 12th century Gothic period: exquisite stained glass that is prized as both an art and a craft. Jeff 's background combines many years of intense study and solid artistic experience. As a superb illustrator and designer, he has received national recognition by his peers, as



is only practiced by a handful of people. His initial interest was piqued by the highly visual stained glass art of a bygone era and he was drawn to its rich history and famed artistry. He was particularly inspired by stained glass that was first created in the Middle Ages; stained glass that captivates the eye, passionately stirs the spirit and is still treasured for its distinct beauty and superb craftsmanship today. Jeffery Hitch is the owner of Vitraux Studios a unique stained



glass art studio. Vitraux Studios specializes in the fine art of masterfully painted, fired stained glass. They create new windows, painted and non-painted and do restoration work on damaged windows.







Student Samples

March Program Re-Cap: Cindy Lantier Program Presentation March 27th "The Art of Soapmaking"

The March Program was presented by Cindy Lantier of 'The Eclectic Soul' and 'Soap's On!' who talked about the art of Soapmaking. A longtime member of Redlands Art Association, she spent many years creating art using mixed media. These days she is following a childhood dream by turning her talents to the art of soapmaking.

She described her upbringing on a farm in Arkansas during which she indulged in various artistic endeavours. However when she expressed a desire to make soap, her mom said 'No'. Cindy thinks her may have said 'no' because she remembered her grandmother making soap. Soap is made by combining a very strong base, typically lye or caustic soda, with fats and oils. In those days it was quite a process, as lye had to be extracted from ashes and it was also difficult to ensure that the lye water was the correct strength.

These days we can buy lye and mix it with water, and by following tried and tested formulas (much like we follow a recipe for baking a cake), it has become a much simpler process to mix the lye solution with an oil or selection of oils. Cindy shared some interesting aspects of the chemistry involved, for example that when the lye is added to the water an exothermic

reaction occurs and the solution becomes very hot. Although the lye solution does have the capacity to burn, with a couple of precautions such as careful pouring and the wearing of



goggles and a long sleeved shirt it is not as scary or dangerous as many think. When blended together, the lye and oil molecules combine together and form soap and glycerin. The lye no longer exists as long as the correct amount of lye is used for the chosen oils. Different oils have different properties in soapmaking, for example Castor Oil promotes lathering, whereas Olive Oil, helps to create a harder bar of soap. After pouring in a mold, the mixture is left to harden for around twenty four hours before it actually becomes soap. It can then be cut into bars after which it needs to cure for 4-6 weeks. Cindy explained how to color the soap, create layered and marbled patterns, and add scents. She gave a demonstration of the lye water and oil mixing process and passed around some beautiful samples of her soaps. All in all it was a very enjoyable evening during which Cindy provided a lot of insight into this very exacting art.

Cindy has led two very fun soap making workshops at Redlands Art Association and more are planned.



Jean (Pio Marmai) is the prodigal son returning home to Burgundy, France to the family's vineyard and his ailing father. He has been absent for ten years. As he walks on the country road that leads to the vineyard the viewer is introduced to the beauty of the rolling hills of Burgundy. We meet Jean's two siblings Juliette (Ana Giradot) who has been running the operation of the vineyard during their father's illness and Jeremie (Francois Civil) who lives at an adjacent vineyard run by his father-in-law a prominent winemaker. As the story develops we learn why Jean left and of his life in Australia.; of the tight bond and love that exists among the three siblings despite the ten year rift, of their struggle to preserve the family vineyard as they discover the complexities and hardships of inheritance tax. If you enjoy good wine, would like to know about the day to day rigours of an active vineyard, witness the angst of the grower at harvest time, how wine is made, the tastings, the preparation of the soil, the effect of the climate, the glorious celebration at the end of harvest party then you DON'T WANT TO MISS THIS FILM. The cinematography is gorgeous, the acting realistic and a real Meursault winemaker is featured in the film. CHEERS!

In this her first feature film writer-director Hamoud brings to the screen an opportunity to demystify any preconceived notion of the life of young Palestinians living, working, studying in Israel. The story centers on three women sharing an apartment in Tel Aviv - Lalia (Mouna Hawa) a criminal lawyer, Salma (Sana Jammelieh) a cook/bartender /DJ and Nur (Shaden Kanboura) religious Muslim University student. Lalia & Salma are modern women who enjoy smoking cigarettes and joints, drinking at clubs and entertaining. Nur does not, but needs a place to stay that's close to school. Lalia's & Salma's party life appear frenetic at times to the sedate Nur who tries to adapt to her newfound exposure to modernity despite disapproval from her religious fiancé and his urgings to leave Tel Aviv and hasten their marriage. We get an insight into the traditional mores that influence their desire to be progressive and modern when Laila falls in love with a modern Muslim man but is he? Salma is subjected to matchmaking demands by her traditional Christian parents and Nur wants a career first not marriage. When something catastrophic occurs to one of them they unify in supportive ways that illustrates some of the circumstances that exist in the Arab-Israeli political world that handicaps the younger generation of both societies from moving forward into the 21st century. The chemistry between these three female leads is delightful with a script and direction that flows beautifully into a refreshingly enjoyable film. ANOTHER NOT FOR WOMEN ONLY FILM.

Large Attendance for Caroline Park Plein Air Contest

On April 7th, a beautiful Saturday, artists jumped at the chance to plein air paint in the "Celebrate Caroline Park" Plein Air Contest, co-sponsored by RAA and the Friends of Caroline Park. Caroline Park is a Redlands city park dedicated to showcasing California native plants, with its spring blooming plants framed by mountain vistas. Over a period of five hours, artists completed one to three paintings, turning in one the same afternoon for judging by plein air master Elin Thomas. A well-attended reception followed that evening.

Thomas found it hard to choose the winners, whittling 23 paintings first down to eight finalists, then picking 4 for awards. First place went to Rudy Estanque's "Walk at Caroline's Trails", 2nd to Nita Harper's "Caroline's Collection", 3rd to Duree Waseem's "Through the Bushes". Then, because Thomas couldn't let go of "Stokes Mansion" by Christine White, she chose it for a last-minute addition 'Juror's Choice Award'.

The paintings, many by esteemed plein air artists in Inland California, will be up as the featured artist show through April 27th. Four paintings have already been sold—don't miss this one.

Featured Artist: John Brownfield

April 28 to May 18
Opening Reception in conjunction with RAA's
"Celebrate Redlands" Saturday April 28th, 4 to 6 pm

I am looking forward to putting together an interesting little show. Works in drawing and painting media vary from the humorous and playful "self portraits as a potted plant" and other paintings to figure drawings in various mediums. This "featured artist" little show opens with the same opening reception for RAA members show, 4-6 pm Saturday April 28.

Artist's Statement: Thanks to those folks who are taking the time to have a look my work. A little more about me, as people seem to like a little personal information about an artist when considering their work. I grew up in Chicago, the city, on the north side, obligatory Cubs fan. I went off to college at Illinois Wesleyan University where I earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree where I met my first wife (and married too young). I began graduate work at University of Iowa but money pressure forced me (us) to move back to Chicago where my wife returned to a caseworker job with Cook County. I was admitted to the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, a move I wish I had taken first of all. A generous amount of units from Iowa transferred in and I was accepted into candidacy and loaded up a large course load and finished and awarded my MFA two years after Bachelor degree.

I got real lucky in getting a full-time teaching gig at Portland State University. I was hired as sabbatical replacement and was invited to stay on the following year. Nice, BUT I was invited to make a visit to Redlands. The late Margaret Clark, who was a professor at the University of Redlands, was most instrumental in





this. I had made an application to a position at the University of Redlands while still in grad school. Job went to someone else, then position re-opened. Meanwhile, Margaret was on sabbatical, which included a stop the Art Institute where an old acquaintance worked, and arranged a morning interview



with me. Early the next semester I was invited to interview everybody and I got the job (well... I found the unrelenting grayness of Portland depressing—figured heat was preferable). I arrived in August of 1965. And the job was what I wanted; small liberal arts department, tremendous flexibility in course design, easy, friendly, connections with other disciplines, small class size... very much like my experience at Illinois Wesleyan. There is a lot of luck in the arc of my academic career. I found myself holding the position one would expect to obtain after 10 or 15 years of part-time gigs, sabbatical jobs, etc. So I spent the next 6 years rising up to a position as a full, tenured professor (also a stint as department chair) and retired after 38 years.

As for growth as an artist; My first love, my enduring refuge has been in drawing the human image. I have never grown tired of practicing and life drawing. There was a special time when I had a colleague who shared this love. The ten years John Nava and I shared this enthusiasm were an enormous influence on me. The other major influence on my art was in making several trips to Europe... I have been profoundly influenced by the great humanist, and classicist tradition... particularly Italian art of the 15th, 16th, 17th centuries. I hope you can see the echo of this tradition in much of my work.





Joint Featured Artist: Jo Sutt

May 19 to June 8 Reception: Saturday May 19th, 4-6pm

Even as a small child I had an interest in art. I have always looked at the interesting things in the world and wondered how I might represent them with



drawing or painting. I have done a little doodling with pencil here and there throughout my life, created many art projects, bulletin boards and classroom murals during my 33 year career as a para-educator and even took a couple of life drawing classes as a mature adult, but had never done any serious artwork or study until 2015 when I started taking classes with well-known artist, David Fairrington. I initially focused on pencil drawing until, at David's urging, I finally picked up a paint brush and began to explore watercolors. I immediately fell in love with the medium! I find it to be maddeningly frustrating and, at the same time, immensely satisfying. Every stroke is a learning experience and I love the transparency and unpredictability of the water and the pigments. I alternately find myself growling and grumbling under my breath when my colors muddy or my painting looks overworked or tortured, or giggling with delight when I surprise myself with something beautiful!



My favorite subjects are flowers, animals and people, especially children. I find people to be the most challenging and I owe a debt of gratitude to those friends and family who have good-naturedly allowed me to practice on them. Sometimes I get a good likeness but a lousy painting, other times a quality painting but a poor likeness. The magic happens when both come together! I am so thankful for my subjects' patience and support throughout my continual learning process!

With David's encouragement, I have entered several art shows and have been pleasantly surprised with the outcomes. I have won awards and accolades from artists and from art appreciators and have been selling my work quite successfully. I recently retired and have been able to devote more time to this exciting new endeavor and I plan to continue to paint until I drop!
