May Presentation: 'The Painted Window' A History of Stained Glass

Presented by Jeffery Hitch of Vitraux Studios

Tuesday May 22, 7 pm

In this presentation Jeffrey will take you through the thousand-year history of stained glass. We will briefly review how this art emerged and evolved through the ages. We will start in ancient Egypt, travel through the Romanesque period and look at the Gothic period where



great advancements were made. We will move onto the Renaissance, Victorian, Craftsman and Art Deco periods, enjoying slide examples of inspirational work done by Master Artists. He will comment on famous artists such as William Morris, Alphons Mucha, Tiffany, and LaFarge. He will explain and provide slide examples



of how architecture was influenced by stained glass. We will look at the history and evolution of tools and materials, construction and fabrication. We will finish

up with a look at what's happening today in stained glass and where the industry is going. New technologies blended with old world craftmanship have brought stained glass to a whole new level. Examples of my work

will be available to provide up close painted stained glass pieces for the community of Redlands Art Association. There will also be a time for questions and answers at the end of the presentation.

Having graduated from Cal State University Fullerton as

a Graphic Design and Illustration major Jeff spent over half of his career in the advertising industry doing all types of collateral material for companies. Upon leaving the advertising business he taught Drawing, Graphic Design, Photoshop and 2D Design at Concordia University for 3 years. Gradually he became involved with stained glass and finally came back to what he



loves most, drawing and painting on glass. He works for stained glass studios across the country on new and old windows and has been teaching workshops at Beveldine LLC for the past 6 years. He was in a very successful 2 person gallery show at Humphries Gallery in Flintridge 2016, exhibiting a nautical series of glass paintings.

Jeff has a passion for a very unique type of artistic expression. It's a dynamic artistic medium that was in existence before the 12th century Gothic period: exquisite stained glass that is prized as both an art and a craft. Jeff 's background combines many years of intense study and solid artistic experience. As a superb illustrator and designer, he has received national recognition by his peers, as well as by many prestigious clients. Not content to follow in the footsteps of standard artistic avenues of expression, Jeff set out to learn and master an art that is only practiced by a handful of people. His initial interest was piqued by the highly visual stained glass art of a bygone era and he was drawn to its rich history and famed artistry. He was particularly inspired by

stained glass that was first created in the Middle Ages; stained glass that captivates the eye, passionately stirs the spirit and is still treasured for its distinct beauty and superb craftsmanship today. Jeffery Hitch is the owner of Vitraux Studios a unique stained glass art studio. Vitraux Studios specializes in the fine art of masterfully painted, fired stained glass. They create new windows, painted and nonpainted and do restoration work on damaged windows.

In this her first feature film writer-director Hamoud brings to the screen an opportunity to demystify any preconceived notion of the life of young Palestinians living, working, studying in Israel. The story centers on three women sharing an apartment in Tel Aviv - Lalia (Mouna Hawa) a criminal lawyer, Salma (Sana Jammelieh) a cook/bartender /DJ and Nur (Shaden Kanboura) religious Muslim University student . Lalia & Salma are modern women who enjoy smoking cigarettes and joints, drinking at clubs and entertaining. Nur does not, but needs a place to stay that's close to school. Lalia's & Salma's party life appear frenetic at times to the sedate Nur who tries to adapt to her newfound exposure to modernity despite disapproval from her religious fiancé and his urgings to leave Tel Aviv and hasten their marriage. We get an insight into the traditional mores that influence their desire to be progressive and modern when Laila falls in love with a modern Muslim man but is he? Salma is subjected to matchmaking demands by her traditional Christian parents and Nur wants a career first not marriage. When something catastrophic occurs to one of them they unify in supportive ways that illustrates some of the circumstances that exist in the Arab-Israeli political world that handicaps the younger generation of both societies from moving forward into the 21st century. The chemistry between these three female leads is delightful with a script and direction that flows beautifully into a refreshingly enjoyable film. ANOTHER NOT FOR WOMEN ONLY FILM.

RAA member and teacher Martha Cowan won the prestigious Gold Medal Award at the San Dimas Festival of Arts the last weekend in April.



Redlands Photographer Wins 1st Place at 2018 National Orange Show

RAA member Bruce Herwig's photo essay on the Foothill Grove Packinghouse won 1st place in the *National Orange Show (NOS) Photo Contest.*

Once surrounded by groves and competition, the Foothill Groves cooperative located in Redlands, CA is the last remaining packing house in the Inland Empire. Founded in 1924, this local cooperative washes, sorts, waxes, packs and ships oranges and grapefruit throughout the world."

According to Bruce "I was able to arrange exclusive insider access to take photographs showing the path of an orange from stem to store."

Bruce said "I've wanted to photograph Foothills Grove for a while. After a year of trying, I was able to arrange permission and a tour from one of their past employees. I received an education and inside view of the history and challenges of the citrus industry."

"While touring the plant, I was surprised at the mix of low and high tech that is used. The same place that still uses a water-based hydraulic lift that was installed in 1948 uses a sophisticated software controlled assembly line and electronic grading system. I will never look at an orange the same again!"

"I'm planning on using one the images in my 2019 Redlands Calendar."

The 20 x 30 metal print titled "Packinghouse Promenade" was on display at the NOS Citrus Fair and is currently displayed at the Redlands Foothills Groves.

2018 National Orange Show

Tuesday May 1st was the reception for the **2018 National Orange Show All California Juried Art Exhibition**. It was a beautiful show held in the Renaissance Room at the Orange Show grounds in San Bernardino. RAA was well represented with at least one quarter of the artists showing being members. Featured Artist: John Brownfield

April 28 to May 18 Opening Reception was in conjunction with RAA's "Celebrate Redlands" Saturday April 28th

I am looking forward to putting together an interesting little show. Works in drawing and painting media vary from the humorous and playful "self portraits as a potted plant" and other paintings to figure drawings in various mediums. This "featured artist" little show opened with the same opening reception for RAA members show, Saturday April 28.

Artist's Statement: Thanks to those folks who are taking the time to have a look my work. A little more about me, as people seem to like a little personal information about an artist when considering their work. I grew up in Chicago, the city, on the north side, obligatory Cubs fan. I went off to college at Illinois Wesleyan University where I earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree where I met my first wife (and married too young). I began graduate work at University of Iowa but money pressure forced me (us) to move back to Chicago where my wife returned to a caseworker job with Cook County. I was admitted to the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, a move I wish I had taken first of all. A generous amount of units from Iowa transferred in and I was accepted into candidacy and loaded up a large course load and finished and awarded my MFA two years after Bachelor degree.

I got real lucky in getting a full-time teaching gig at Portland State University. I was hired as sabbatical replacement and was invited to stay on the following year. Nice, BUT I was invited to make a visit to Redlands. The late Margaret Clark, who was a professor at the University of Redlands, was most instrumental in





this. I had made an application to a position at the University of Redlands while still in grad school. Job went to someone else, then position re-opened. Meanwhile, Margaret was on sabbatical, which included a stop the Art Institute where an old acquaintance worked, and arranged a morning interview



with me. Early the next semester I was invited to interview everybody and I got the job (well... I found the unrelenting grayness of Portland depressing—figured heat was preferable). I arrived in August of 1965. And the job was what I wanted; small liberal arts department, tremendous flexibility in course design, easy, friendly, connections with other disciplines, small class size... very much like my experience at Illinois Wesleyan. There is a lot of luck in the arc of my academic career. I found myself holding the position one would expect to obtain after 10 or 15 years of part-time gigs, sabbatical jobs, etc. So I spent the next 6 years rising up to a position as a full, tenured professor (also a stint as department chair) and retired after 38 years.

As for growth as an artist; My first love, my enduring refuge has been in drawing the human image. I have never grown tired of practicing and life drawing. There was a special time when I had a colleague who shared this love. The ten years John Nava and I shared this enthusiasm were an enormous influence on me. The other major influence on my art was in making several trips to Europe... I have been profoundly influenced by the great humanist, and classicist tradition... particularly Italian art of the 15th, 16th, 17th centuries. I hope you can see the echo of this tradition in much of my work.





Featured Artist: Jo Sutt

May 19 to June 8 Reception: Saturday May 19th, 4-6pm

Even as a small child I had an interest in art. I have always looked at the interesting things in the world and wondered how



I might represent them with drawing or painting. I have done a little doodling with pencil here and there throughout my life, created many art projects, bulletin boards and classroom murals during my 33 year career as a para-educator and even took a couple of life drawing classes as a mature adult, but had never done any serious artwork or study until 2015 when I started taking classes with well-known artist, David Fairrington. I initially focused on pencil drawing until, at David's urging, I finally picked up a paint brush and began to explore watercolors. I immediately fell in love with the medium! I find it to be maddeningly frustrating and, at the same time, immensely satisfying. Every stroke is a learning experience and I love the transparency and unpredictability of the water and the pigments. I alternately find myself growling and grumbling under my breath when my colors muddy or my painting looks overworked or tortured, or giggling with delight when I surprise myself with something beautiful!

My favorite subjects are flowers, animals and people, especially children. I find people to be the most



challenging and I owe a debt of gratitude to those friends and family who have good-naturedly allowed me to practice on them. Sometimes I get a good likeness but a lousy painting, other times a quality painting but a poor likeness. The magic happens when both come together! I am so thankful for my subjects' patience and support throughout my continual learning process!

With David's encouragement, I have entered several art shows and have been pleasantly surprised with the outcomes. I have won awards and accolades from artists and from art appreciators and have been selling my work quite successfully. I recently retired and have been able to devote more time to this exciting new endeavor and I plan to continue to paint until I drop!

Featured Artist: Janet Edwards— Printmaker, Watercolorist, California Artist, and Redlands Treasured Artist

June 9th to 29th

Opening Reception in conjunction with RAA's "Faces & Places", Saturday June 16, 3 to 5pm

Janet Edwards is a California artist whose work reflects her love of the natural beauty of California, though beautiful scenes from traveling to other places are also depicted in her art. Many of her etchings include embossing as part of the design. She has also worked in other print media, especially serigraphy. While working primarily in the etching medium, she is also an accomplished watercolorist, and a watercolor-like style is often reflected in her work.

Etchings are printed from metal plates upon which an image has been etched with acid to produce a texture that will hold ink. Each print is the result of hand inking on the plate and printing by pressure under the roller of an etching press. Though the prints of the same design are as ;much alike as a hand process will allow, minor differences from print to print may sometimes be detected. Inasmuch as each print is the direct end product of the artist's work, and printed by her from the plates she has created, it is one of a series of multiple original pieces of art and not a copy or reproduction.

Janet's work often depicts the rugged central and northern Caifornia coastline, as well as the flowers, trees, wildlife, and buildings characteristic of the state. Her series on whales illustrates what you might see, if you were lucky enough, during the yearly migration





of these huge mammals. She is especially well known in the inland Southern California area for her depiction of the tall palm trees, mountains, and orange groves common to that region. Janet has also produced

designs based upon travel to other states, and to England, Scotland, Ireland, Mexico, and Canada.

Janet Edwards' art work is in homes, civic buildings, and offices throughout California, in all 50 states of the Union, and at least 40 other countries. Her work has been chosen by educational, cultural, and civic organizations to honor dignitaries, professors, musicians, ambassadors, politicians, and many other special people.

After earning a B.A. degree in Art Education at the University of Redlands, she taught public school art before raising a family. She has been a past president of the Redlands Art Association, the program chair, and for 13 years- since its inception- she has been a member of the Margaret Clark art enrichment committee (MCAEEF). She has been an active participant in the RAA Gallery since the early 1980s.

Printmaking coursework was taken at Long Beach State University, Westchester Adult School, Santa Monica College, and San Bernardino College, followed by many years of work in she & husband Fred Edwards' home studio.

Janet Edwards' work is currently available through Highligh Gallery, Mendocina, CA, The Chambers Gallery, Cambria, CA, Earthworks Gallery, Yachats, OR, Smith Jewelers, Redlands, and Redlands Art Association. Featured Artist: Wendy Quine

June 30th to July 20th Opening Reception Saturday June 30, 3 to 5pm

I am looking forward to being the featured artist June 30 to July 25. For those of you who don't know me, let me



introduce myself. I grew up in Southern California drawing the animals and mountains and oceans I loved. My mother tells me about the art racket I had going in first grade when my classmates would ask me to draw their mothers' favorite subjects, only to pawn them off as their own in order to receive their parents' accolades. My creative side grew throughout high school and saw expression in paintings, sculptures, and many props for drama productions.

Most of my formal art education was from Indiana University, Bloomington, and University of St. Francis, Ft. Wayne, IN, where I earned my Master's in Education with a Concentration in Art. With my B.A. in English and Education, I had an art teaching minor in Indiana, so for the next 20 years I taught high school art and English, always encouraging the creativity in my students through creative writing and poetry. I have worked in and taught many media, but my favorite is watercolor for its flowing pigments, transparent depiction of mood and atmosphere, and the many "happy accidents."

In the 80's I was juried into the Southern Arizona Watercolor Guild while teaching and painting in Tucson, AZ. Enjoyable experiences there include showing and selling my paintings at the yearly show in the U. of A. Art Gallery and attending workshops by watercolorists Tom Hill and Zoltan Szabo. The sheer delight I experienced while viewing the world's great art during two trips to Europe inspired me to create art that just might inspire others. The dramatic scenes I photographed on trips to Sedona and Monument Valley in Arizona, and Santa Fe and Taos in New Mexico have influenced many of my paintings, one of which, "Mist and Mittens" was juried into the Multi Media Miniature Show at the RAA. My work has grown through classes I have taken at RAA and through teaching Beginning Watercolor classes for "Artists of the High Desert"



at their gallery on Main St. in Hesperia. (I'm currently their "Featured Artist" through June 28.) My work is in corporate and private collections in California, Arizona, Oregon, Washington, Indiana, and Florida. I'm looking forward to seeing you at the "Artist's Reception" June 30.
