Collect your art at Take-In! We have no storage at the gallery, only the sheds which are prone to leaking and vandalism! You leave your art at your own risk, the RAA will not pay for damages for work left in the gallery.

Please bring some NEW art supplies like packets of pencils, colored pencils, crayons, children's watercolor boxes, markers and drawing pads of different sizes.

Attic Art Sale

Friday January 31 & Saturday February 1, 2020

The Attic Art Sale was a new event sponsored by the Redlands Art Association (RAA) and Redlands Festival of Arts (RFA), which benefitted youth arts education and other programs in the community. The organizers envisioned a one-day sale with over 100 pieces of art that you might typically buy in a gallery, but at bargain prices. The event was a huge success last year with a Friday evening Opening Reception and sales and the sale continued all day Saturday.

While you're bringing out the holiday decorations from the attic, the closet and the garage, think about the gift of donating your gently used art pieces to the Attic Art Sale, Friday 31st January & Saturday, February 1st, at The Museum of Redlands (MOR).

Shirley Harry, Event Chair, said, "This is a wonderful opportunity to edit your collection and share art that you've enjoyed, but no longer have a place to display. Best of all, you'll be helping us raise badly needed funds for youth arts education." According to Harry, people often call the RAA and the RFA to ask what they can do with inherited artwork or pieces that they've purchased and no longer want. Unfortunately, it's harder to sell art on the secondary market than one might think. Your artwork may be worth more as a tax deduction than through a traditional sale by the time promotional costs and commissions are accounted for.

This event offers art lovers an opportunity to donate their artwork to a local charitable organization for a potential tax deduction. Art donors will fill out a donation form listing the artwork and its value but will need to consult a tax professional to comply with IRS rules. "All donors should understand that their artwork will be sold to buyers at attractive prices. The goal of this event is to create a fun-filled event where one can purchase art for their personal enjoyment and home decor," Harry said. Patty Mariano Denning has been designing and making custom jewelry for over twenty-five years. Her younger sister helped invite friends to one of her first shows. "Please come see my big sister's jewelry." That was the beginning of Big Sister's Jewelry.

Patty's love of traveling to exotic locations and a life-long affinity for scuba diving inspires many of her jewelry designs. She enjoys creating — using



sea glass, sea shells, vintage pendants from around the world, pearls and mixed metals. Her customers refer to her designs as "classic with a punch" and "addicting."


Some days Patty feels like a "hippy" and other days like a "diva." Life is too short to wear boring jewelry. Have fun, be bold, and release the adventurer within."

Featured Artist: Ruth Wood, Glass Artist

Dec. 14-Jan. 9 | Reception: Sat., Dec. 14, 2-4pm

I was born in Riverside, grew up in Long Beach, and returned to my "roots" in 2003. I majored in art in high school and early college years with emphasis in metalsmithing and ceramics with a lot of macramé thrown in as that was a "thing" back then (I even won awards with it).



I love glass. It is clear or opaque. It can block the light or let it through. It is fragile but can be strong, or we wouldn't make windshields out of it. It's decorative, functional, or both. I wanted to pursue glass blowing after high school but the only opportunities in those days were too far away, or too expensive. Reality set in, and I thought it best to pursue a career that may prove more lucrative in the long run. Art became a "hobby".

In the summer of 2010, my husband and I were browsing through the Sawdust Festival. There was a lot of glass art, but it wasn't all blown. I asked one of the artists how she made her plates and bowls. She explained that it was all fused glass, fired in a kiln, somewhat like ceramics. And that was all she wrote! I've read every book, and taken all the classes I can find, many from the pioneers of the technique. Opening the kiln is like Christmas morning, and I get to celebrate it many times a year.

Recently, I took some classes from some excellent artists and metalsmiths. I would like to thank Franesca Watson and Robert Lopez for bringing me back. My most recent work combines my old love of metalsmithing with my new passion for glass. I am

completely blessed.

Thank you to the Redlands Art Association for providing such a wonderful, and affordable, outlet for artists to show and share their work. I'm flattered and honored that I was selected to be the Featured Artist. And thank you to my



husband for his endless support and encouragement. He never even asks why I need two polishing wheels or why I've drilled all those tiny holes in that really nice piece of wood he was planning on lathing into a pen!



My mother (Ann McNamee) was very creative. She sewed, cooked, made bread dough Christmas ornaments and "snakes" out of juice cans (don't ask), plus, she could draw, a skill I have yet to develop. She also loved glass. We discovered and shared many outlets for our creative drive, but never glass. She passed away just before I learned about fused glass, and I named my company Mack Glass after her.

Adeola Davies-Aiyeloja, Contemporary Intuitive Artist/ Educator

A self-taught artist with no formal training in art, Adeola has a way of bringing colors together to create a visual sensation. "When you look at my paintings, you feel the joy and happiness the colors convey," Adeola said. Adeola is very aware of colors and forms and how they work to captivate her audience.

Adeola first public exhibition was at National Orange Show where she won honorable mention for her work "Wings of Love." She has since won many awards for her paintings and jewelry designs. Adeola was the featured artist at the 1997 Inland Empire Alzheimer's Association Art Auction and the Annual African-American Artist Festival. Her image "Serenity" and "Praising the Lord" were used as the poster image respectively. She has exhibited at local and National juried shows and also served as juror for local art competitions. Adeola is proud of her involvement with the African American Summerfest from 1992-1998 special youth exhibition called, "Tomorrow's Masters" which honors youths from kindergarten

through 12th grades. She was a member of the task force committee in formulating the County Cultural Plan for the County of San Bernardino. Her work is in both public and private collection, such as Toni Morrison, Riverside Art Museum, Chaffey Community Museum of Art, National Orange Show, Loma Linda Ronald McDonald House and many more.

Adeola works in different mediums. Her first love is the oil and acrylic medium. For several years, she developed a love for the printmaking process. Adeola now works with both mediums to create some of her work. In addition to painting, she enjoys working with enamels and metalsmithing to create wearable art. Some of Adeola's paintings have been shown on the set of Fox's television drama "Time of your Life," NBC's drama, "The Others," ABC's "Greys Anatomy", "Blackish", most recently HBO's "Insecure" and CBS's "The Neighborhood" and many more.

51st Multi Media Mini Show: Call for Entries

Get back to your studio and make us some art!



Plan on entering

your art in the 51st Annual Multi Media Mini Show, Redlands Art Association's juried art show on Sunday, Feb. 16, 2019. The Mini Show is unique to the Redlands Art Association. What makes it different from all other judged exhibits is:

- 1) the Multi Media part of the show: artists may submit photography, digital (computer) work, fiber art, drawings, glass, sculptures in wood, stone, and metal, as well as the traditional fine arts-oils, watercolor-acrylic-pastels, etc., etc.
- 2) the Mini part: the size limitation of the art piece to $14-\frac{1}{2}$ " including base or frame (i.e. it must fit in a $14-\frac{1}{2}$ " cube).

Any artist residing in California or a member of the Redlands Art Association may submit up to three recent original pieces of work. RAA membership is **not** required. All work must be for sale. Entry is in person, Sunday, Feb. 16, 2019, 10am–4pm, at the RAA Sales Gallery & Art Center, 215 E. State St, downtown, Redlands. Winners of the competition will participate in over \$2000 in cash and product awards. The show will be on display at the Gallery through March 13th. Naturally, its success has spawned similar shows, however, the MMM Show is still the only one of this scale in Southern California. The prospectus and entry form for the show will be online and at the Gallery next month.
