David Garcia is a retired professional civil engineer who has been a resident of Redlands for 42 years.



He served as Utilities Director for the City of Redlands for 12 years. He enjoys playing golf (twice per week) and working with rocks. He joined the Orange Belt Mineralogical Society, along with his son, to make certain types of rocks into beautiful gemstones. He believes

that gemstones by themselves are nice to look at, but are nicer if made into jewelry.

David has been honing his skills in the art of wire wrapping of gemstones to make beautiful pendants and necklaces.



The rocks he has acquired over the years have come from various sources and places. The rocks that he cuts and polishes come from Africa, South America, Afghanistan, Mexico, Canada, the USA, and many other places in the world.

David is now making framed wall hangings and decorations. They are mosaics consisting of many different gemstones. Recently, he completed a mosaic clock and is currently working on a large mosaic

butterfly. He showcases his pendants at the Redlands Art Association Gallery and the Edward Dean Museum.



About his work, **Joe A. Oakes** says, "Each painting is an emotional response to color... real or imagined but always felt."

"All of us, in varying degrees, have become blind to the colors of our world. Nature is the ultimate inspiration but the mind dictates the color of things without true observation. As a way of awakening our minds to color, I strive to create an alternative version of the



world. Therefore, I create something unique by using color as the catalyst between what you think you know and see and what the world can be."

She grew up with a fascination for art of all types and spent many years using icing as her medium while she was a professional cake decorator and instructor.



Michelle holds an Associates' Degree with an emphasis in painting and continues taking workshops to learn new ways to achieve different techniques and enhance her skills. She is a member of the California Watercolor Association, Watercolor West, National Watercolor Society, the Associated Arts of the Inland Empire and is a Signature Member of the Wyoming Watercolor Society. Michelle has shown her paintings at galleries in California, Texas and Wyoming.

Michelle is inspired by the world around her and all



the colors in nature. She uses this inspiration to vibrantly achieve the scenes she paints. Using watercolor as her medium she is able to create views of florals, land and seascapes with a glowing effect. She loves the way paint and paper react; with

contrasts in hard and soft edges, with dark and light value and color melting on the paper to create shapes and forms that lead the viewer to see the glorious color in this brilliant world around us.



David Lines has created stunning art glass through many mediums and forms for over 30 years. His stained and leaded glass commissions and repair work can be seen in historic homes throughout Riverside, as well as Greene & Greene inspired windows at St. Mark Presbyterian Church of Newport

IN MEMORIAM

Lucille von Wolffersdorff 1920-2019



Lucille died in November 2019 at Plymouth Village where she has lived for many years. She was 99 years old and still painting in the Plymouth Village art studio until a few months before her death. She was a long-time member of RAA. She and her daughter Joy shared

the Featured Artist Corner a few years ago.

Lucille finished her memoir "Little Shasta Valley" last year but didn't live to see it published. It is now for sale on Amazon Books and possibly in the Gallery later. It describes her youth on a cattle ranch in northern California.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, January 18, 2020 at 12pm at Trinity Episcopal Church, 419 S. Fourth Street, Redlands. Reception to follow.

Joanne Ohnemus, Remembered



Joanne Ohnemus was a member of RAA for more than 25 years, showing her birdhouses and garden-related art. Although her medium in the early years was watercolor, acrylic, oil, photography, monoprint, and collage, her art that we know now, uses wood, recycled materials and cast-away objects.

Most of the art relates to nature and the great outdoors, but she occasionally took up some abstract design.

In 1992, Ohnemus and her husband, Edward, decided to have a project both could work on... they loved original creative designs and colorful paint, so they started "Bird Abode." Edward designed and constructed each birdhouse and Joanne lovingly painted, numbered, and signed each one. During the process of making birdhouses, the inspiration of the assemblage art piece was developed. Facades and full birdhouses have been used on these one-of-a-kind artworks. Recycled materials and castoffs from her artist friends were used in many of their sculptures. Joanne also made mosaic wood jewelry, alcohol ink framed tiles, garden box planters, and multi-media cards.
